The College has always had a reputation for its dramatic productions. Thefollowing information has been compiled from the College Magazine, except for productions since 1949.

The first reference to dramatic work is a report of a visit to the College and a Lecture by F.R. Benson in 1910. It was repeated in 1911. The first production appears to have been Sheridan's 'The Critic' in 1913. "Bravo, ye pioneers of the College Dramatic Society." says the report. "We were glad to see you for once occupying different roles and especially glad because you are our very own, the same individuals whom we daily meet at table, in the common room or the corridors. We thought it 'vastly well done', gentlemen, 'vastly well.' More would we say, but space forbids. Long life and prosperity to the Dramatic Society." Mr. George Wilkinson was Dangle - and the 'coach.' The College Orchestra provided music and the performance was preceded by songs.

There is no indication as to what play was produced!
