SIR OR MADAM,

1. I am directed to inform you that you have satisfactorily completed your period of training and are regarded by the Board of Education as qualified by attainments for recognition as a Certificated Teacher. You have also satisfied the Board as to your age and physical capacity. You are accordingly now recognised by the Board as a Certificated Teacher from 1st August, 1923 (Schedule I. A. 2 (i) of the Code).

Your Certificate may be endorsed as soon as you have within twenty-four consecutive months completed one year's service as a Student-Teacher (if rendered before the 1st August, 1914), an Uncertificated Teacher, or a Certificated Teacher in England or Wales in a Public Elementary School, or a Certified Efficient School, or a Certified School for Blind, Deaf, Defective, or Epileptic Children, or a Poor Law School, or a Certified Industrial or Day Industrial School, or a Certified Reformatory.

5. With regard to your position under the School Teachers (Superannuation) Act, 1918, your attention is directed to the enclosed Form 37 Pen. Paragraph 1 (a) thereof may be ignored in your case, unless your entry into recognised service is unduly delayed.
