


Our aim today is to raise money to donate towards The Leeds Kidney Research Fund.

Three years ago the College received a letter from a former student teaching in Nairobi asking if we could help by sending money to provide clothing for the children she was teaching. BECKETT PARK ESTATE MONKS, MAYORS and MONEY!

The land on which the College stands was once owned by the monks of Kirkstall Abbey. It was called New Grange. There would be a simple stone building to shelter the monks who were here involved in sheeprearing.

When the abbey was dissolved in 1539 the land came on the market. A house was built on the site where the Foxcroft family lived. This house was rebuilt in 1626 by Benjamin Wade whose family continued in possession of the estate until the early 19th century. Two members of the Wade family served as Mayors of Leeds.

Walter Wade rebuilt the house in 1752 and there are remains of this building at the rear of the present house. In the early 19th century the occupiers of the house included Samuel Buck, Recorder of Leeds and John Marshall, prosperous linen manufacturer.

In 1834 William Beckett, banker and later M.P. took over the estate which still bears his name. His coat of arms can be seen on the front of the house which became known as Kirkstall Grange in the 19th century.

A number of alterations were made to the house especially about 1858 when bay windows and a balustrade were added. William Beckett, a much respected man, died in 1863 worth £700,000.

Members of the Beckett family continued to live at Kirkstall Grange until about 1908 when the house and about 40 acres of land were bought by the Leeds Education Committee and a "training college" for teachers was opened in 1912.

New buildings were erected then and at intervals later but happily the old house, which has seen so many changes, remains in use and serves as a reminder of the continuity of English life.

THE COLLEGE


The City of Leeds College for the training of men and women teachers was established in 1907 by the Leeds Education Committee in temporary buildings, and moved to Beckett Park in 1912. Carnegie College of Physical Education was opened in 1933, on the same campus as City of Leeds College, to train men specialist teachers in physical education, the capital cost of premises and initial equipment being met by the Carnegie United Kingdom Trust. Originally it provided one-year courses only, for trained teachers and university graduates. Since 1960, however, Carnegie College and the City of Leeds College have worked in close co-operation to provide a three-year course of initial training for men with specialisation in physical education. The two colleges became one in September 1968 and all physical education, for both men and women, is now undertaken in the Carnegie School of Physical Education, a constituent part of the City of Leeds and Carnegie College.

The estate of nearly a hundred acres includes woodland and open parkland, a garden for rural studies, and playing fields. It was originally the park of Kirkstall Grange, an eighteenth century mansion now used as a hall of residence. The original buildings, erected in 1912, included the teaching block, seven halls of residence and the swimming bath, and the Carnegie College buildings added a teaching block, gymnasia and another hall of residence. Buildings erected in recent years include a tenth hall of residence, the refectory, new buildings for science and modern languages, gymnasia, a covered training area, a medical centre and a student centre. A major reconstruction of the playing fields was completed in 1971.


