Party to Sports Students' Congress in Berlin in connection with the Olympic Games,

July 23rd-August 17th (inclusive dates July 22nd-August 18th.

£7-10-0 <u>must</u> be paid to the Treasurer by Wednesday, June 3rd for advance purchase of party travel tickets and purchase of registered marks (allowing £1 per week and £1 for food on two journeys). To find this money is a necessary condition of inclusion in the party; further registered marks will be obtained if desired.

Passports must be produced and handed to the Secretary by the same date.

Professor Dr. Jaeck will be director of the Physical Education Congress.

The invitation to this congress is worded as follows:-

"The Olympic Games, with their gathering of the best athletes of all nations and of the leaders of sport from throughout the whole world, offer a unique opportunity for the study of physical education. We therefore have the honour to invite all nations participating in the Olympic Games to send to the Games a team of male sport students, who will be our guests from their arrival at the German frontier and during their entire stay in Germany. We would fix the number of each team at thirty men. We propose to accommodate these teams in simple, soldierly fashion, and correspondingly they would have their meals together. Thursday, the 23rd July, 1936, is foreseen as the date of arrival of the teams, and Monday, August 17th, as the date of departure. The joint work will commence on the 24th July. The entire period of the Games will be available for the joint work; during the Games the mornings will be devoted to it, whilst on the afternoons there will be opportunity to witness the Olympic contests. The joint work is so proposed that first daily there shall be sport, that then the schools shall mutually display their work in sport displays, and finally lectures and discussions shall be held. The language of the congress shall be German, but French and English lectures shall be admitted. Naturally excursions and visits in Berlin and the surroundings are also planned. joint work will be carried out under uniform direction. expect that the discipline of all groups necessary for the success of the joint work will be assured. We would request your friendly intimation by the 31st May, 1936, as to whether we can count on your acceptance of this invitation. as a sufficient number of acceptances has been received, we shall work out a programme and forward it to all countries which will visit us".

Housing will be in tents in the neighbourhood of the Reich Sport Field in Grunewald; field beds and tents will be provided.

Rules.

1. Every student should bring with him uniform outdoor attire (grey flannels, Carnegie blazer, Carnegie striped tie, two white cricket shirts, two ordinary shirts with collars, grey socks and brown shoes - hat to be decided), Carnegie training and sports attire including white shoes and white socks, rugger jersey and blue shorts, swimming suit, bath and hand towels, raincoat and I suitcase. No heavy luggage

- 2. Teams should be able to sing marching and camp songs of their country and bring their own musical instruments.
- 3. Work begins at 8 a.m., the mornings being devoted to gymnastics, cross-country, swimming, sports and some lectures, the afternoons to visits to the Olympic Games and places of interest. The evenings are occupied with community singing and camp-fires, visits to theatres, etc., and are occasionally free.
- 4. It should be understood that sports students will abstain from alcohol and tobacco. If there is a student who thinks he cannot abstain, he is asked to withdraw his nomination in favour of another companion.
