JUNIOR CITY SCHOLARSHIP.

Conditions of holding a Junior City Scholarship.

- I. If the holder of a Junior City Scholarship leave the school during the first four years of the tenure of the Scholarship, all payments made on behalf of the holder during the preceding twelve calendar months will at once become due from the parent or guardian, unless the leaving be due to illness or to some other cause which may be satisfactory to the Education Committee; and, if after those four years the holder leave during the currency of any school year for which the Scholarship may have been renewed, the payments made on behalf of the holder for such year will in like manner become recoverable.
- 2. A Scholarship will be tenable so long only as the scholar continues to attend regularly at the selected School, and properly conducts himself or herself, follows the course of study prescribed, and makes reasonable progress therein to the satisfaction of the Education Committee. The Governing Body of the School will certify as to such matters at the end of each Term, or such other period as the Education Committee may desire.
- 3. No person holding any other Scholarship will be entitled to hold a Junior City Scholarship unless with the consent of the Leeds Education Committee, who may impose such terms as they think fit, including a reduction of the amount of the Scholarship, as a condition of their consent; but, subject to this condition, Candidates otherwise eligible will not be debarred from competing by reason of their already holding a Scholarship.

I hereby undertake to attend regularly and punctually at the Leeds Central High School, and to observe the Conditions of holding Scholarships prescribed by the City Council, and the Rules and Regulations of the School.
