

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION FOR THE
CERTIFICATE, 1911.

PART I.

MEMORY DRAWING.

Friday, December 16th, 1910, 10.0—12.0.

Candidates must fill in the particulars asked for on the drawing paper.

Make a drawing from memory of *one* of the following groups of objects as it would appear if placed several feet in front of you below the level of the eye :—

(a) A pastry board, a pudding basin, and a dinner plate.

Or,

(b) A circular tray, a rectangular box with a hinged lid half way open, and a milk jug.

N.B.—1. The objects may be grouped in any way you choose, but credit will be given for the arrangement or composition of the group, as well as for the accuracy of the drawing, and the completeness of the representation.

2. The drawing must fairly fill the sheet of paper supplied to you. **SMALL DRAWINGS WILL BE CANCELLED.**

3. Your drawing may be executed in pencil or any other medium, including water-colours.

Water-colour drawings must be made on *white* paper only. The use of body colour (chinese white) is not allowed.

4. Measuring, ruling, and other mechanical means of execution are forbidden.

5. Your paper may be placed with either the long or short side towards you, whichever may be suitable to the proportions of the group, but it must not be turned about during the examination.
