## INFORMATION FOR WOMEN STUDENTS.

The Session 1911-12 will begin on Tuesday, 19th September, 1911. Resident Students must be in the Hostel by 4.30 p.m. on Monday, 18th September. Day Students must be in College by 9.0 a.m. on Tuesday, 19th September.

Hostel Students should forward the fee of £20 to the Principal, The City of Leeds Training College, Kirkstall Road, Leeds, not later than 15th September.

A Certificate from a duly qualified dentist, stating that the teeth are in proper condition—
if not already sent—should be forwarded to the Principal of the Training College at once. If the
teeth are not sound they should be attended to as soon as possible.

Any Student who has been in contact with an infectious disease must immediately notify the Principal. (See enclosed Health Certificate.)

Students residing in a Hostel must bring with them, in addition to their ordinary apparel:-

A waterproof cloak or coat, an umbrella, two pairs of strong walking boots or shoes, a pair of low-heeled house slippers, a woollen dressing gown, a pair of bedroom slippers, a clothes brush, toilet requisites, two bath towels, two bags of washing material for soiled linen, three table napkins, a long-sleeved pinafore of washing material for use in the laboratory. (No flannelette blouses may be worn in the laboratories.)

A supply of underclothing to allow of two changes is necessary. It should include woollen vests or combinations.

All underlinen, boots, &c., must be marked with the owner's name in full. All laundry articles must also be marked with the owner's name and laundry number. The number will be supplied on admission.

All Students will be expected to have a gymnasium dress, and a games skirt. In order to procure uniformity, these will be made at the commencement of the Session from material supplied at cost price by the Training College.

The dress of Students should be as neat and simple as possible. A serge or tweed coat and skirt, with a shirt of washing material are suitable for every-day wear. It is not desirable that cotton blouses be worn during the winter months. Highly-trimmed skirts and blouses should not form part of the outfit.

On the occasion of College Festivities it is hoped that Students will wear white.

Walking boots must not be worn in the College or in a Hostel.

Students will be required to wear a white sailor hat with a College ribbon. These must be obtained at the College. This rule applies to Day Students on their way to and from College, and to Students in residence in the Hostels at all times except on Sundays, and when they are away on leave of absence.

As the Hostels are situated two to three miles from the centre of the city, luggage—except that which can be carried easily in the hand-should be forwarded, prepaid, to the Hostel to which the Student is attached. Each trunk or packet should be marked with the full name of the owner, and should be despatched by Thursday, 14th September.

In case of difficulty on the day of arrival, full information can be obtained at the Education Department (Higher Section), Calverley Street, opposite the Town Hall, and a few minutes' walk from the Railway Stations.

It is essential that both Resident and Day Students take part in the social life of the College and in the College games. Students will provide their own hockey sticks and racquets. A charge of 5s. per annum will be made towards the expenses of the games. This is payable on admission to the Treasurer of the Athletic Club.

Lyndhurst is situated in North Grange Road, the first turn to the right beyond the penny stage on the Headingley tram route, and is the last building on the left-hand side of North Grange Road.
