INFORMATION FOR MEN STUDENTS.

The Session 1911-12 will begin on Tuesday, 19th September, 1911. Resident Students must be in the Hostel by 4.30 p.m. on Monday, 18th September. Day Students must be in College by 9 a.m. on Tuesday, 19th September.

Hostel Students should forward the Fee of £20 to the Principal, The City of Leeds Training College, Kirkstall Road, Leeds, not later than 15th September.

A certificate from a duly qualified dentist, stating that the teeth are in proper condition—if not already sent—should be forwarded to the Principal of the Training College at once. If the teeth are not sound they should be attended to as soon as possible.

Any Student who has been in contact with an infectious disease must immediately notify the Principal (see enclosed Health Certificate).

Students residing in a Hostel must bring with them, in addition to their ordinary apparel:—

- A waterproof or overcoat, an umbrella, two pairs of good walking boots, a pair of house shoes, a pair of slippers, a clothes brush, toilet requisites, two bath towels, two bags of washing material for soiled linen, four table napkins.
- A supply of underclothing to allow of two changes is necessary.
- All underlinen, boots, &c., must be marked with the owner's name in full. All laundry articles must also be marked with the owner's name and laundry number. The number will be supplied on admission. Students should provide themselves with a dark suit. A silk hat is desirable.

As the Hostels are situated two miles from the centre of the City, luggage—except that which can be carried easily in the hand—should be forwarded, prepaid, to the Hostel to which the Student is attached. Each trunk or packet should be marked with the full name of the owner, and should be despatched by *Thursday*, 14th September.

In case of difficulty on the day of arrival, full information can be obtained at the Education Department (Higher Section), Calverley Street, opposite the Town Hall, and a few minutes' walk from the Railway Stations.

It is essential that both Resident and Day Students take part in the social life of the College and in the College Games. There is ample accommodation for Tennis, Football, Hockey, and Cricket. Students will provide their own Tennis Racquets and Hockey Sticks. Outside the provision of the grounds, the expenses of the various athletic clubs will be borne by the Students themselves. A charge of 15s. per annum will be made towards the expenses of the games. This is payable on admission to the Treasurer of the Athletic Club.

In order to reach St. Ann's Hill, Students should take the Burley Road Car from City Square to the bottom of Cardigan Road (fare id.). St. Ann's Hill is situated about ten minutes' walk from the bottom of Cardigan Road.

Buckingham House is situated about two minutes' walk beyond the penny stage (Headingley car) from the City Square.

In order to reach The Tower, Students should take the Headingley car from City Square to Hyde Park. The Tower is situated about two minutes' walk from Hyde Park.
